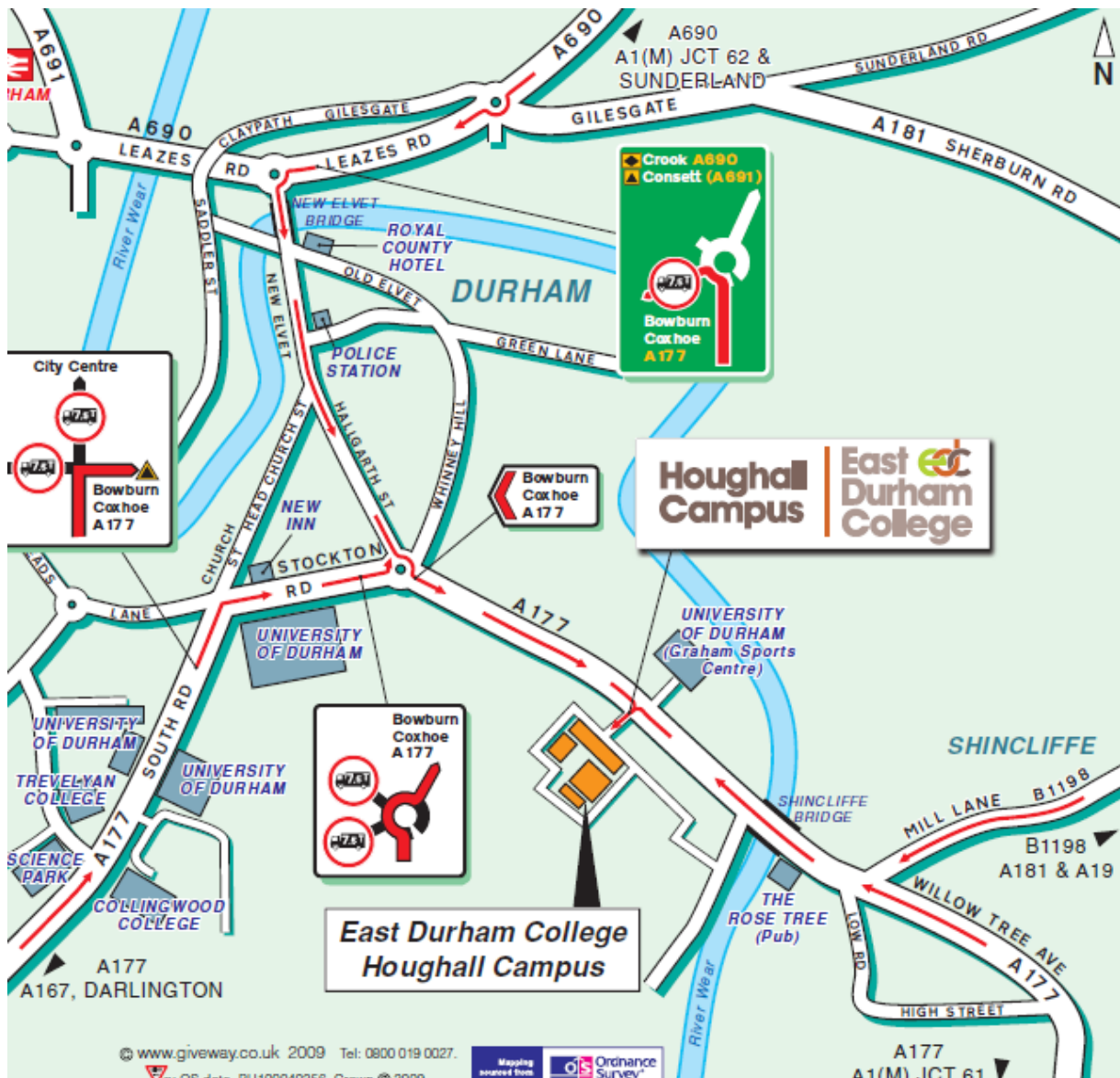

The fee must be paid when staging otherwise any exhibits not paid for will be withdrawn from the show.

Timings

Staging - 12pm—10pm Friday 28th August

Judging - Judging will commence at 07:30 on Saturday 29th August.

Public Entry - The show will open to the public 10:30 - 17.00 on Saturday 29th & Sunday 30th August

Removal of Exhibits - No exhibitor will be allowed to remove an exhibit once staged until 17.00 on Sunday 30th August 2015. All exhibits must be removed from the show by 18.30.

Prize Money Collection - Any monies won can be collected from the show secretary between 12.00 & 17.00 on Saturday 29th and 11.00 & 18.00 on Sunday 30th. Any money not collected in these times will be donated to the chosen charity.

Horticultural Section

- 1) All exhibits must be the produce of the exhibitor and must have been grown on land occupied by him/her.
- 2) Floral art exhibits must be constructed at the show during the times specified, with the exception of miniatures, button holes and corsages.
- 3) The show will be conducted in accordance with the rules and standards contained in the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook 2008, except where under this schedule rules obviously do not apply.
- 4) Vases, dishes and boxes will be provided. Exhibitors may use their own bowls.
- 5) Notice of objection to any exhibit must be made in writing to the show manager not later than 3pm on Judging Day accompanied by a £10 deposit.

Industrial Section

- 1) All exhibits must be made or worked by the exhibitor.
- 2) No exhibits will be accepted which has won a prize at any previous show or is more than 3 years old.
- 3) All exhibits in Cookery must be produced by the exhibitor.
- 4) No exhibits can be moved without the consent of the show manager.

While every care is taken with exhibits, no responsibility can be borne by the Committee for loss or damage to the exhibits.

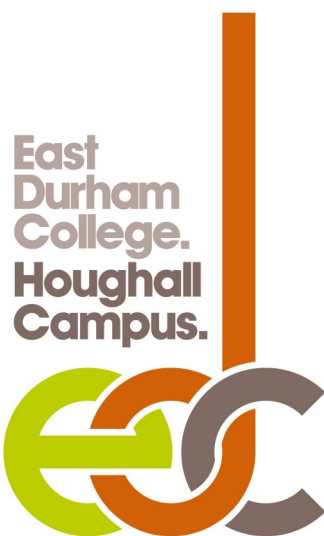
